

Semetic use of morphem 't', prefixed or infixed.

Commonest function seems reflexive or middle

Accadia shows reciprocal use sometimes, usually separative & reversing

Hitpa'el absorbs all 't' forms thanks the successful use of ṣāḏ and ṣāḏp.

1. on closer examination, all these atypical Hitpa'els turn out to connote repeated or continuous action (those where there is no middle?)

ie. Hitnahelel, to come into & remain in possession this points to the Hitpa'el class in an Akkadian. (the prel became durative, but there used to be a distinction)
